BARMORE-DeHAYES FAMILY

The Barmore family lived in a house in Baychester, Bronx, New York at 2325 Boller Avenue in 1930.

Stephen Leroy Barmore, Sr. lived in Baychester, Bronx, NY at 2325 Boller Avenue with his wife, Gladys (DeHayes), and two children. He and his family lived with his wife's parents in their house.1

Stephen lived in four of the five boroughs of New York City, being born in Brooklyn on October 29, 1894, son of New Yorkers William and Annie Barmore. At the tender age of 17 he joined the New York State National Guard² and served for 3 years from 1913-1916. By 1918 during the World War I draft registration, he claimed exemption for several reasons: he had already served in the NY militia, and by then he had a wife and child. He was living in Brooklyn, and worked as a bookkeeper for a musical instrument company in Manhattan. He married Gladys DeHayes after he left the NYS National Guard in 1916, and before his WWI Draft Registration in 1918.

Gladys DeHayes was born in Manhattan, New York on October 18, 1896, daughter of Louis Peter DeHayes and Ellen Heageney. She lived in Manhattan until her marriage to Stephen Barmore around 1917, when she then lived in Brooklyn.⁴

By 1920 Stephen and Gladys were living with Gladys' parents in Manhattan⁵, and Stephen had changed careers from bookkeeping to being a salesman in dry goods. Between 1925-1930 his father-in-law bought a house and moved from Manhattan to the country in The Bronx, and Stephen and his wife Gladys and two children moved with him, to 2325 Boller Avenue, which is where we find them all in 1930. Sadly, by 1930 Stephen and Gladys had had three children, but only two were with them; it is presumed one of their children, Arthur Barmore, had died.

His tenure in Baychester lasted a few short years. Perhaps his financial situation was improved enough that Stephen moved his wife and two children out of The Bronx and into Queens, which is where we find him in 1935⁶. It is also possible that upon the deaths of his in-laws that their house was sold, requiring Stephen to move. He continued to work as a Salesman/Clerk in the tobacco industry all the way through 1942,⁷ our last sighting of him.

Gladys (DeHayes) Barmore passed away in March 1988 in Queens.
