Joseph George Caio and Virginia Genevieve (Fesselmeyer) Caio lived at 2213 Hunter Avenue in Baychester during the late 1930s-late 1940s.

Joseph G. Caio was born and raised in The Bronx, New York, the son of New York natives **George Caio** and **Margaret Jacobi**. Joseph was their first child, born December 29, 1918¹, in the midst of the Spanish Flu epidemic. He and his parents survived this epidemic, and his parents went on to have a few more children. His first home was at 611 Van Nest Avenue², which is a few blocks from Westchester Square in The Bronx. I often parked my car on Van Nest Avenue, a street with pretty, well-kept houses, when I visited my mother who lived on Williamsbridge Road, a street running perpendicular to Van Nest Avenue.

Virginia Genevieve Fesselmeyer was born on March 29, 1919 in New York City, the third child of **Charles and Alice Fesselmeyer**. Her first home was 143 Willis Avenue in the Mott Haven section of the Bronx.

Joseph Caio married **Virginia Fesselmeyer** in 1938 and they rented a house in Baychester at **2213 Hunter Avenue**³ with their two children, **Robert** and **Joseph Jr**. Joseph Sr. was working as a machinist's helper on the railroad.

After WW II broke out, Joseph joined the US Army in 1945⁴; he was 27 years old, with a wife and two children. He was discharged about 18 months later, in 1946. In 1947 Joseph and Virginia divorced.

After his divorce Joseph stayed in New York, but the exact location is unknown. Did he move to New Rochelle, New York, which is where his siblings are found in the 1990s? **Joseph Caio** died March 26, 1990⁵. Where he might be buried is unknown.
