George Christopher Fellows and **Violet (Stark) Fellows** and their two daughters rented a house at **2200 Palmer Avenue**, Baychester, Bronx, New York in 1940. George and Violet also lived there in 1935, presumably right when they got married. This house was a corner house, at Palmer and Bassett Avenues.

George Christopher Fellows was born in the Bronx on May 26, 1909², son of New York native **Edward Fellows** and **Lena Umberg** (an immigrant from Switzerland). His father Edward, who was born and raised in New York, worked as a railroad mechanic his entire life. Edward's wife, Lena Umberg, emigrated from Switzerland in 1894 at age 19, married Edward in 1901 in New York, and had five children, one died, raising four children. George was their third child. George grew up at 251 East 153rd Street, what is known as the South Bronx today. After his father died in 1930, George's mother eventually moved in with her daughter **Mildred Lenihan's** family, which is where we find **Lena Fellows** in 1938³.

Violet Stark was born about 1912 in New York, the daughter of **Walter Stark** and **Elsie Banta**, both New York natives. Her father Walter was a well-known boat builder. Violet grew up in Baychester at **2211 Boller Avenue**.

George C Fellows married **Violet Stark** around 1935, and they lived at **2200 Palmer Avenue** in Baychester, two blocks from where Violet grew up. George supported his family by being an architect.¹ George and Violet raised three daughters: **Marilyn, Carole, and Virginia**. The youngest daughter was the author's sister's friend in Baychester in the 1950s and 1960s, who remain friends now in 2018.

After leaving the Bronx some time after the 1960s, **George and Violet Fellows** moved to Pelham, Westchester County, New York. **George Fellows** died in June 1971⁴. It is not known where he might be buried.
