## FITZPATRICK-MILLIGAN

Joseph Patrick G. Fitzpatrick and his wife Susan (Milligan) Fitzpatrick lived in Baychester, Bronx, NY at **2075 Bassett Avenue** in 1950.<sup>1</sup>

Joseph P. Fitzpatrick was born on March 25, 1897 or 1898 in County Down, Ireland<sup>2</sup>. He was the son of **Peter and Catherine Fitzpatrick**<sup>3</sup>. He immigrated to Detroit, Michigan in March 1927 via Ontario, Canada. Susan Milligan was born on March 5, 1896 in County Down, Ireland<sup>2</sup>. She immigrated to New York around 1925-1926.

Joseph Fitzpatrick and Susan Milligan were married in Bronx, New York on October 28, 1928<sup>3</sup>. They lived in various places in the Bronx, NY before coming to Baychester around 1947, living at 2075 Bassett Avenue. While in Baychester, Joseph was a Bartender at a Bar & Grill and his wife Susan was the Cook at that Bar & Grill. The business was known as The Hideaway Inn and was quite popular with the neighborhood residents as well as folks who came into the neighborhood to enjoy some boating and fishing. Joseph Fitzpatrick owned this business with a partner, John McVey.

Joe Fitzpatrick was also known as an Irish playwright, many of which he produced and performed in. He wrote over 50 plays - some of them were: "Gods Go Nowhere," "Proof of Love,", "Love and Country,", "Last Glimpse of Erin," and "Wedding of Maureen Molloy."

Although registering for the WWII Draft in 1942, Joseph was unable to serve because he had a glass eye.<sup>5</sup>

They raised three children: Catherine, Peter, and Susan Fitzpatrick. A fourth child, Joseph Patrick Fitzpatrick, died shortly after birth in 1935<sup>6</sup>.

In 1951 Joseph, his wife Susan, daughter Susan and son Peter went to Ireland for a visit for several months before returning to Baychester.

Joseph Fitzpatrick died on March 10, 1964 in New York<sup>6</sup>. It is not known where he might be buried. No further information was found on his wife Susan.
