

HARTMANN-CINQUE

The Hartmann family lived in the following houses in Baychester:

1930 2308 Hunter Avenue

1940 2350 Hunter Avenue

Carl Joseph Hartmann and **Carmella Cinque** were married about 1926¹ and moved to The Bronx. Carl was born in Brooklyn on January 24, 1897², the son of German and Swiss immigrants. His wife, Carmella, was 10 years his junior, and was born in New York about 1906, the daughter of Italian immigrants, **John and Catherine Cinque**. Both Carl and Carmella were first-generation Americans.

Carmella lived in Manhattan in 1910³ and by 1920⁴ was living at 426 College Avenue, still a young girl living with her parents **John Cinque** and **Catherine (Demayo) Cinque**, one of six surviving children. Her father was a dealer at a produce market, as were many Italian immigrants who worked in the fruit and vegetable markets.

By 1930 Carl had established himself as an automobile mechanic. He and Carmella had settled in Baychester and rented a house at **2308 Hunter Avenue**¹. By 1940 Carl and Carmella had purchased their own house, and moved in down the street at **2350 Hunter Avenue**. Carl still worked as an automobile mechanic. He worked 52 weeks a year, earning \$1,734 in 1939. They had two children by then, and Carmella's younger unmarried sister **Rita Cinque** was living with them.⁵

After 1942 we lose track of this family and their children.
