HOFFMAN-SCHALK

Rudolph William Hoffman and his wife Johanna Schalk lived in a boathouse in Baychester at 2160 Baychester Avenue in 1920. It was located on the Pelham Park side of the railroad tracks. Back then, Given's Creek extended to Baychester Avenue. Rudolph supported his wife as a boatman.1

Rudolph Hoffman was born around 1881 in Lubeck, Germany, son of German parents George Hoffman and Hermina Warncke². Rudolph immigrated to New York on October 22, 1902 at age 21. ³ His US contact was his brother **Will Hoffman** in New York. Rudolph gave his occupation as a forsterer – this is probably a misspelling of some type of occupation, unknown.

Rudolph got married on May 6, 1906 to a young, 20-year-old Frankfurt, Prussian immigrant named Elsa Auguste Wolf, daughter of Frank Wolf and Margaretha Faustann/Faustaun². No more information has been located on Elsa since her wedding.

By 1910 Rudolph is living with his brother William and family, still in the Bronx, but is listed as single⁴ – no information on what happened to Elsa.

Rudolph got married a second time to Johanna Schalk, after 1912. Johanna immigrated to New York on September 17, 1912. She was born in Austria on April 20, 1880, daughter of Austrians **Anton Schalk** and **Cecelia Cren**. ⁵ 1920 is when we first find Rudolph and Johanna together in Baychester.

Rudolph Hoffmann died on February 18, 1927 at age 45. He had retired by then, and was still living at 2160 Baychester Avenue. He was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery, Bronx, New York.⁶
