LOTTER-SCHUSTER-HEFFNER

Charles J. Lotter owned and lived at 2327 Baychester Avenue in Baychester, Bronx, New York. He lived there with his first wife Mary (Schuster) Boinay¹. He later lived there with his second wife Louise Heffner². Charles lived at this house in Baychester from before 1918 until the house was taken by the city for the development of Bruckner Boulevard (now known as the New England Thruway) in the late-1930s.

Charles J. Lotter was born on August 20, 1879 in New York City, New York, the son of German immigrant **Jakob Lotter** and mother's name unknown. It is assumed he grew up in New York City, New York. No records were found prior to his marriage to widow **Mary (Schuster) Boinay**. They were married the day before Thanksgiving Day, on November 26, 1913 in the Bronx, New York.³

Mary Schuster was an Austrian immigrant, born about 1877, the daughter of Michael Schuster and Elizabeth Verderber. When Mary married Charles in 1913, Mary was already a widow of Mr. Boinay.³ No information was found on who Mr. Boinay was. Mary and Charles had no children. Unknown when she died or where she might be buried.

Louise Heffner was the second wife of **Charles J. Lotter**. She was the daughter of German immigrant **Ernestine Heffner**, and father unknown. Louise and Charles married some time before 1925 because we find Louise already as Charles' wife in 1925. Louise was a New York native, born about 1881. She and Charles had no children.² Unknown when she died or where she might be buried.

Charles Lotter worked his entire career as a Motorman, starting with the 3rd Avenue Railway, a streetcar, in 1918.⁴

By 1940 after being forced out of his home on Baychester Avenue, Charles bought a house and was living at 68 Cloverdale Avenue in White Plains, Westchester, New York with his wife Louise, and several boarders⁵.

Charles J. Lotter died at age 80 in White Plains, Westchester, New York on November 21, 1960⁶. Unknown where he might be buried.
