NICOLL

William Fredrick Nicoll, a widow, purchased a house at **2207 Hunter Avenue** in Baychester, Bronx, New York. This was done between 1930-1935. The house was a block from Givan's Creek. ¹

William F. Nicoll was born in New York City, New York in 1876, the son of native New Yorker William Samplon Nicoll and native Massachusettsan Eliza Maria Kinnear. On October 28, 1905 William married Carrie (Caroline) Davis, in the Bronx, New York. Carrie Davis was born in 1881 in New York, daughter of Germans John Martin Davis and Celia Wolf.²

For the next 20 years William lived with his sister **Emma** and brother-in-law **Ferdinand Weiss** at 283 E. 141st St, Bronx, NY. William and Carrie had two children: **Florence Caroline Nicoll** (b.1906) and **William K. Nicoll** (b.1910).³ In 1910 he was a machinist for a taxi meter company. When he completed the WW I draft registration in 1918 he indicated his nearest relation was his sister **Emma Weiss**, with whom he lived. He did not mention his wife Carrie, who was probably deceased by then. His occupation was Inspector of Licensed Vehicles for NYC Licensing.⁴ In 1930 William, widow, and his two children were still living in the Weiss household, continuing to support his children as Inspector for NYC Bureau of Licensing.⁵

When he moved to Baychester in the 1930s he was retired, and lived there with no family. His wife was deceased; his children moved away. However, he rented part of the house to a large family, the **McGinnises**, so he wasn't really alone. No addition information has been found on this Nicoll family.
