William Martin Paul lived at **2226 Boller Avenue**, Baychester, Bronx, New York in 1940. He was born in Manhattan, New York on Oct. 7, 1875, son of **August Paul**, a German immigrant, and **Dora Weinheimer**, a native New Yorker. He was the second of nine children of August and Dora.

William lived in the south Bronx, New York, at East 154th Street, most of his adult life, before he moved into Baychester just prior to 1940. In 1905 he married **Anna Royeman** and they had one daughter, **Dorothy Paul**.² However, William and Anna lived separately after 1915, their daughter staying with Anna and Anna's brother **Herman Royeman**. Neither William nor Anna remarried.

William Paul owned a gas station, and was a skilled gas engine repairman. It is unknown what happened to him after 1940, nor when he died or where he might be buried.
