Charles Joseph Pearsall and **Katherine Morstatt** were married on December 13, 1929 in the Bronx, New York.¹ They lived together in Baychester at **2323 Palmer Avenue** in 1930,² next door to Katherine's father John and brother George. By 1940 Charles and Katherine and their three children moved out of Baychester to 434 Taylor Avenue,³ in the Harding Park area of the Bronx, New York.

Charles Joseph Pearsall was born in The Bronx, New York on March 2, 1906,⁴ the son of **William Henry Pearsall**, a native New Yorker, and **Annie Becker**, a German immigrant. He grew up in the Fordham Heights area of the Bronx.⁵ He was a last of six children.

Katherine Morstatt was born in New York about 1911, the daughter of **John Morstatt** and **Louise Marth**, both German immigrants. She grew up in the Pelham Bay area of the Bronx, New York.⁶ She was the last of three children.

Charles and Katherine had three children, all born in the 1930s: Joan, Charles, and William. Charles supported his family as a truck driver. By 1940 they had moved out of Baychester, their house being taken by the City of New York for the Bruckner Expressway expansion and exit ramp.³

Daughter Joan Pearsall died in 1990.⁷ The whereabouts of her brothers Charles and William are unknown.

Charles Joseph Pearsall died on January 16, 1980 in Pinellas, Florida.⁸ It is not confirmed where he might be buried. It is unknown what happened to **Katherine Pearsall**.
