SCHOBERT-HLAWITSCHKA

Herman Schobert and his wife **Hilda Schobert** lived in Baychester at **2314 Palmer Avenue**. Palmer Avenue was a family affair. Relatives owned several houses next to each other on Palmer Avenue.¹

Herman Schobert was born on June 29, 1895 in Auing, Wörthsee, Starnberg, Oberbayern, Bavaria, Germany.² He grew up in Germany, and immigrated to America in September 1924, a single young man, traveling alone, with an occupation of butcher. He arrived to live with his aunt, **Anna Dietrich**, in Manhattan, New York.³

By 1927, Herman had met and married **Hilda Hlawitschka**. Hilda was born in 1900 in Austria, and immigrated to America with her sister **Marie Hlawitschka**, arriving at Ellis Island on November 24, 1922. Upon arrival, the Hlawitschka sisters came to live with their uncle **Emil Hlawitschka** in Manhattan, New York.⁴

After marriage, **Herman and Hilda Schobert** originally set up housekeeping in the Mott Haven section of the South Bronx, New York. Between 1930 and 1935 they had moved to Baychester, buying the house at **2314 Palmer Avenue**. They raised three children in Baychester: **Hilda, Charlotte, and Herman Schobert**. A cousin, **Anton Sedlmayer**, also lived with them around 1940. Anton Sedlmayer and Herman Schobert shared the same occupation of Butcher.

Herman Schobert died in The Bronx in March 1973. His burial location is unknown. His wife Hilda is also deceased, but no specifics are known.

THEIR CHILDREN

Daughter **Hilda Schobert** was born on March 31, 1928 in New York. She married a Baychester boy, **Frank Joseph Rom, Jr**. See separate biography ROM-SCHOBERT.

Daughter **Charlotte Hertha Schobert,** born in 1930 in The Bronx, married the boy next door, **William Krueger**. They are written up separately - see KRUGER-SCHOBERT biography.)

Son **Herman J. Schobert, Jr.** was born on March 22, 1933 in The Bronx. He joined the US Army and fought in Korea. Herman married **Elizabeth Ann Drake** in Clarkston, Rockland County, New York on May 5, 1962.⁸ No additional information is known about Elizabeth.

Herman J. Schobert, Jr. died on May 3, 1988⁹ and is buried in Calverton National Cemetery, Suffolk, New York; he has a military gravestone for his service to his country. ¹⁰
