**John Christian Stark, Sr.** and his wife **Mary Platte** lived in Baychester in the early years when there were no house numbers. They lived on **Baychester Avenue**<sup>1</sup> and **Wright Avenue**<sup>2</sup>.

**John Stark** was born in the Melrose section of The Bronx in October 1857. His parents were German immigrants **Christian Stark** and **Elizabeth Spangenberg**.

**Mary Platte** was born in Michigan in August 1859. She was the daughter of German immigrant **Joseph Platte** and Pennsylvania-born mother **Catherine Pieffer**. Mary was the second of four children born in Michigan. Her parents then moved the family to New York where three more children were born.

John Christian Stark, Sr. and Mary Platte were married in Manhattan on Christmas Eve, December 24, 1889<sup>3</sup>. By 1900 they were living in Baychester on **Baychester Avenue**. Back then, the houses did not have house numbers, and the streets were dirt. They had seven children there, and John supported the family as a Saloon Keeper.

In 1903 there had been a large train explosion in Baychester, and John Stark's boat house on the bay was destroyed by the concussion.<sup>4</sup>

By 1910 they had moved to **Wright Avenue**. Again, the houses did not have house numbers. Wright Avenue was along Givens Creek. There they had another child. John was a Hotel Keeper. They had boarders who were involved in the boating industry in the neighborhood.

John Christian Stark, Sr. died on December 28, 1911 a few days after celebrating his 22<sup>nd</sup> wedding anniversary, in The Bronx. He was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in The Bronx. <sup>5</sup>

By 1920, Mary, now a widow, moved from **Wright Avenue** to a house at **2211 Boller Avenue**. She lived there with her sons Christian, Harry, and Walter, Walter's wife Elsie and their daughter Violet Stark<sup>6</sup>. By 1930 Walter Stark was head of the household with his wife and daughter, and his mother Mary lived with him<sup>7</sup>. By 1940 Mary was living with a different child, her daughter Louise Curtis, in Nutley, New Jersey<sup>8</sup>.

Mary Stark lived another 31 years after her husband's death, and died on December 23, 1942 at the home of her daughter Louise in Nutley, New Jersey. She was buried in The Bronx at Woodlawn Cemetery.<sup>9</sup>

## THEIR CHILDREN

All their children lived in Baychester in their growing-up years.

- **1.** John Christian Stark, Jr. was born in June 1881 in Manhattan, New York, and died October 26, 1941 in the Bronx, New York. John, Jr. started his life in Baychester, and moved around the Bronx and City Island, New York for a few decades, with his wife **Julia M. Keck**, whom he married on June 17, 1914 in Westchester County, New York. They had three children right away. In 1940 he was back in Baychester living with his brother Walter at **2211 Boller Avenue**, no wife, no children. He died on Oct. 26, 1941 and was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in the Bronx, NY. The whereabouts of his wife Julia and children after 1930 are unknown.
- 2. Baby Stark was born on Sept. 2, 1882 in Manhattan, New York 10, but did not survive.

- **3.** Walter Joseph Stark was born on June 25, 1885 in Manhattan, New York. See biography STARK-BANTA.
- **4. Mary Stark** was born on Jan. 8, 1889 in Manhattan, New York. 11 She lived with her parents on **Baychester Avenue** in 1900, and on April 24, 1906 she married **John Edwin Lear** in Manhattan, New York. 12 John Lear was born in Cook, Illinois. No additional information has been located on this couple.
- **5. Philomena Louisa Stark** was born on Oct. 30, 1890 in Manhattan, New York. <sup>13</sup> She lived with her parents on **Baychester Avenue** in 1900. On January 28, 1909 she married **Walter Calvin Light** in the Bronx <sup>14</sup>; they moved to Massachusetts, where they had four children. No additional information has been found.
- **6. Louisa M. Stark** was born in April 1895 in Manhattan, New York. She lived with her parents on **Baychester Avenue** in 1900. On Mar 31, 1918 she married **John Joseph Curtis** in the Bronx. The couple rented a Baychester house at **2327 Baychester Avenue**. That house was eventually taken by the state of NY for the construction of Bruckner Boulevard. The couple then moved permanently to Nutley, New Jersey. They had three children. No additional information has been found.

- **7. Christian Edward Theodore Stark** was born on Nov. 1, 1897 in Manhattan, New York.<sup>17</sup> Like his siblings, he lived on **Baychester Avenue**. In 1924 he was married and living at **2327 Baychester Avenue**<sup>18</sup> with his brother John. **Christian Edward Theodore Stark** married **Sophie Johanna Langhorst** about 1922. By 1930 they had moved to Nutley, New Jersey, where they raised two children.<sup>19</sup> He supported his family as a machinist. He died on April 20, 1955 in Nutley, New Jersey, and was buried at Crest Haven Memorial Park in Clifton, Passaic County, NJ.<sup>20</sup> His wife. Sophie, died in 1974 and was buried with Christian.<sup>21</sup>
- **8.** Harry John Stark was born on Nov. 1, 1889 in New York. He lived with his parents on Baychester Avenue and on Boller Avenue until he married Ruth H. Dressler in 1929, born in 1905 in New York. Harry and Ruth then lived in an apartment on Roberts Avenue in Pelham Bay<sup>22</sup> before settling in Westchester County, New York where they raised two boys.<sup>23</sup> He supported his family as a machinist and an electrician. Harry John Stark died in Westchester County, NY in 1971<sup>24</sup>. His wife Ruth died in Westchester County, NY in 1980. They are both buried at Ferncliff Cemetery and Mausoleum in Hartsdale, Westchester County, NY.
