

STEINBERG-JACKLE

At age 29 **Alfred Steinberg** immigrated to America in 1929 from Germany¹, leaving behind a wife and a 7-year-old son and an 8-year-old daughter². By the end of 1935, Alfred was divorced from his wife in Germany. On May 5, 1936 Alfred married **Mathilde Jackle** in Manhattan, New York³. In 1937 he filed a Declaration of Intent, and in 1940 he filed a Petition for Naturalization and also took the Oath of Allegiance, becoming a American citizen².

When Alfred came to New York he resided at 2335 Second Avenue in Manhattan, New York, and had a job as an auto mechanic⁴. By 1935 Alfred bought a house in Baychester, Bronx, New York at **2361 Boller Avenue**. He probably bought it newly constructed, as that was the time frame for the houses on that street. He moved his bride Mathilde into this house. They lived there in 1940 as well, when Alfred worked as a machinist for a wholesale grocer⁵.

Mathilde, in 1944, gave her address as **2213 Hunter Avenue**, also in Baychester, when she was a witness to **Anna Loth's** Petition for Naturalization⁶. In 1956 Alfred and Anna gave their address as **2336 Palmer Avenue**, still in Baychester, when they returned from a trip to their native Germany⁷.

STEINBERG-JACKLE

In 20 years, **Alfred and Mathilde Steinberg** lived in three houses in Baychester, each a block or two from the other house.

Alfred was born in Essen, Germany on July 14, 1900, son of German citizens **Karl Steinberg** and **Katharine Brachmann**³. He spent most of his life in America living in Baychester. He died in August 1968 in the Bronx, New York. Where he might be buried is unknown.

Mathilde Jackle was born around 1907 in Niederbuhl, Rastatt, Baden, Germany, daughter of German citizens **Christian Jackle** and **Lena Marstahler**³. Mathilde immigrated to New York from Germany in 1929⁸. In 1930 she worked as a cook for the **Harold Reindel** family, residing in their home on Independence Avenue in the Bronx, New York⁹. In 1940 she is listed as a house worker for a private family⁵. It is not known when Mathilde died or where she might be buried.
