In the early 1940s August Theiler lived in Baychester at 2239 Boller Avenue.

August Theiler was born in Linz, Austria on December 10, 1890. He immigrated to American about 1926. In 1929 he traveled back to Europe and re-entered the US, and was living in Hoboken, New Jersey. In 1933 he again traveled back to Europe and re-entered the US, living on Freeman Street in the Bronx, New York. In 1935 he was back living in Hoboken, New Jersey.

In 1940 **August Theiler** was living at **2239 Boller Avenue**. He worked as a mechanic for a bronze works company.¹ He was not married. He had a roommate, **Nicolo Solito**, from Italy. In 1942 August was still living at 2239 Boller Avenue, but was now working for the Brewster Aeronautical Company in Long Island City, Queens, New York.²

No additional information has been found for August.
