

WEINLEIN-STAAB

Kate (Staab) Weinlein lived in Baychester from at least 1925 through 1940. She started out at **2314 Boller Avenue** in 1925,¹ then was at **2312 Boller Avenue** in 1930² and 1940³. In 1925 she was a widow, having been married to **Joseph Alois Weinlein**, so Joseph died before 1925. As there are no census records found earlier than 1925, it is not known when Kate moved into Baychester, or if her husband Joseph also lived in Baychester.

Kate Staab was born **Katherine Staab** in 1868 in New York City, New York, daughter of **Adam Staab** and **Katherine Kuhn**. Kate married **Joseph Alois Weinlein** on June 15, 1884 in Manhattan, New York. She was just 16 years old; he was 24 years old. Joseph was born in 1861 in Buchan, Germany of German parents **Alois Weinlein** and **Therese Gremminger**.⁴ Kate was apparently pregnant with twins at the time of her marriage in June 1884, as twins **Catherine Weinlein** (1884-?) and **August Joseph Weinlein** (1884-1945) were born on August 23, 1884 in the Bronx, New York. They were followed by **William Weinlein** (1886-1957); **Joseph Weinlein** (1891-1891); **Anthony Weinlein** (1895-1916); **John Weinlein** (1898-?); and **Emma Weinlein** (1911-2000).

Kate never worked outside of the home. In 1925 four of her children were living with her; three were boys who worked as laborers at 2314 Boller Avenue. By 1930 she was living with her son Alois as head of household at 2312 Boller Avenue; one brother, two sisters, one brother-in-law and one niece also lived with Alois. By 1940 it was just August, his brother William, and mother Kate living together, still at 2312 Boller Avenue.

It is not known when **Joseph Alois Weinlein** died or where he might be buried. It is also known when **Katherine (Staab) Weinlein** died or where she might be buried.

Catherine Weinlein was born in August 1884 in New York. We only know about her from the 1930 census.² No other information has been located for her.

August Joseph Weinlein was born on August 23, 1884 in the Bronx.⁵ He and Catherine must have been twins. August never married and became the patriarch of the family. He died on May 2, 1945⁶ at age 60, and is buried in Saint Raymonds Cemetery in the Bronx, New York, alongside his brothers Anthony and William.⁷

William Weinlein was born on October 25, 1886 in New York City, New York.⁸ He lived with his mother and some siblings his entire life, never marrying. He worked as a metal lather most of his life. William died in 1957 and is buried in Saint Raymonds Cemetery⁹ with two brothers.

Joseph Weinlein was born and died on July 1, 1891 in Manhattan, New York. He was buried in Saint Raymonds Cemetery in the Bronx, New York.¹⁰

Anthony Weinlein was born on November 26, 1895¹¹ two days before Thanksgiving in Manhattan, New York. He never married. He lived with his mother and some siblings his entire life, and he died in 1916 at age 24. He was buried in Saint Raymonds Cemetery¹² along with two brothers.

WEINLEIN-STAAB

John Weinlein was born on November 22, 1898¹³ two days before Thanksgiving in Manhattan, New York. He married **Frances Swoboda** and they had three children. (See biography Weinlein-Swoboda.)

Emma Weinlein was born on April 30, 1911 in New York City.¹⁴ This was a long time after her brother John was born, about 12-1/2 years. But in 1925 Emma is listed as **Emma Kretchman**,¹⁵ daughter, living at 2314 Boller Avenue. Perhaps she was adopted. In 1930 she continued to live with mother Kate and several brothers, but she was now married to **Joseph Zerbo** with a newborn child.¹⁶ Joseph and Emma moved out and were living at 1611 Library Avenue in the Bronx with their two children.¹⁷ **Emma Kretchen (Weinlein) Zerbo** died on March 7, 2000.¹⁴ Her husband **Joseph Zerbo** was born in 1906 in Italy and immigrated in 1910. It is unknown when he died, or whether either Emma or Joseph Zerbo might be buried.
